



5719—Frock 35 cents—1/-. New cap sleeves. Sizes 14 to 42. Size 16 requires 35% yards 36-inch dotted linen, 5% yard 36-inch plain. Width about 2½ yards.

5728—Frock 35 cents—1/-, Contrast again. Sizes 14 to 46. Size 16 requires 3 yards 36-inch yellow linen, 1 yard 39-inch white batiste. Width 2 yards.


